Position Statement

As a PhD nursing science student, I am interested in understanding the holistic nature of simulation debriefing, an innovative pedagogy in nursing education. It has been long proven that effective debriefing improves cognitive, affective, and behavioral learning. However, debriefer skills remain subpar, and student engagement can be minimal when they do not find value in debriefing learning. It is my hope that current and future nurse educators are knowledgeable of the active learning process that occurs in debriefing, and confident in implementing effective debriefing strategies. I am interested in examining the relationships of engagement (debriefer and learner) in debriefing practices, debriefing qualities and student learning outcomes. Together with the NJLN, I would like to enhance simulation learning and the debriefer's competency in engaging students in deep reflective learning on professional practice and personal reflection abilities. My dedication to nursing simulation education is exemplified in my research interest, podium, poster and virtual presentations, teaching, and publications. My goal is to increase competent debriefers in the academic or clinical setting, who are committed to student-centered, collaborative, interactive, and psychologically safe debriefing. Effective debriefing skills grounded in theory-based frameworks are much needed in competency-based education for cyclical formative feedback until skills mastery or competency is achieved. I support the need to retain and recruit more educators in New Jersey. A strong educator workforce could also open the gates for student admission into nursing programs, which can increase the much-needed nursing graduates in the community.
