The New Jersey League for Nursing, Inc. to Award \$100,000 in Nursing Scholarships in Support of New Jersey Nurse Education.

NJLN to administer the 2024 Dr. Maureen Sullivan Foley Memorial Scholarship Awards through a grant provided by the Community Health Connections Foundation, Inc.

**Westfield, NJ** The New Jersey League for Nursing (NJLN), a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting nurse education excellence, has announced that they will proudly award \$100,000 in scholarships this year for New Jersey nursing students pursuing their Bachelor of Science (BSN), Master of Science (MSN), and Doctorate (PhD, EdD, DNP, DNS) degrees, with the intent to remain in New Jersey to practice, benefiting the health of the communities in which they serve.

These awards are made possible through the Community Health Connections Foundation (CHCF), Inc., a private grant-making foundation. This marks the fifth consecutive year that the NJLN and CHCF have collaborated to provide scholarships to assist New Jersey nurses with their education as they enter and progress in the nursing profession. This partnership will result in over \$330,000 in scholarships given by the end of 2024.

This year the NJLN is proud to award eight Dr. Maureen Sullivan Foley Memorial Scholarships:

- \$20,000 for a Doctorate Degree (PhD, EdD, DNP, DNS)—Two (2) Awards
- \$10,000 for a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) Degree—Three (3) Awards
- \$10,000 for a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Degree—Three (3) Awards

"We are honored that the Community Health Connections Foundation (CHCF) has once again selected the NJLN to receive this \$100,000 grant that continues to significantly enhance our nursing scholarship program. This demonstrates the CHCF's strong commitment to supporting nursing education at all levels—a crucial investment as we work to build a strong and diverse nursing workforce and address our state nursing shortage.

Providing this financial assistance to help students achieve their academic goals is one of the most rewarding aspects of the NJLN's mission. These scholarships also memorialize the legacy of Dr. Maureen Sullivan Foley, an NJLN past president and influential nurse leader in New Jersey. Dr. Foley was a steadfast advocate for investing in nurses' education to address the health needs of our state's diverse population. Each scholarship represents Dr. Foley's lifelong commitment to advancing the nursing profession," said Donna M. Penn, DNP, RN, CNE, NEA-BC, and NJLN President.
